



## Three more universities deploy BridgeWave's gigabit wireless solution

**BridgeWave Communications has announced that Coppin State University in Baltimore, Maryland, Rush University in Chicago, Illinois, and California State University in Fullerton, California, have adopted its gigabit wireless links to provide network connectivity on college campuses.**

Rush University's Medical Center was expanding into a new facility and needed to connect remote leased space to the campus local area network in the main building. The connection would handle sensitive financial and medical information, so a secure and reliable network backbone was required.

Dick Rader, director of telecommunications for Coppin State University, said: "We installed BridgeWave's radios in a couple of days - without long term service provider contracts. The performance of BridgeWave's gigabit wireless links has been seamless, without any additional ongoing OPEX costs, and with very little support needed from our IT staff."
