Wireless Networks Have 2+ Mile Range

(May 07, 2007) BridgeWave Communications Inc. has introduced two wireless networks to deliver high-speed connectivity at distances over two miles, including over water.

One of the products can automatically switch from gigabyte transmission speeds to 100 Mbps to provide continuous operation during poor weather, such as an intense downpour, according to the Santa Clara, Calif.-based vendor.

Bayonne (N.J.) Medical Center has licensed the product to connect with recently acquired Richmond University Medical Center in Staten Island, N.Y. The connectivity will enable the hospitals to share information systems, avoiding the building of a separate data center at the new hospital that would have topped \$1 million in costs.

Pricing starts at \$36,900 for the Gigabit Extended Ethernet 80 GHz Extended Range network and \$39,900 for the AdaptRate 80GHz Extended Range network.
